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CLASS NEWS

CHESTNUTS

The children have had a busy couple of weeks - they have started practicing for the Nativity. They have been focusing on learning all about number 4 and the 'p' sound this week. Last week they finished the week off with a successful Forest School session where Parents and Carers were invited to come and take part and the children whittled the sticks

to toast the marshmallows.

WILLOW

In English, we have been using the book, The Smeds and the Smoos, as our inspiration. We have created and described our own planets and aliens in preparation for writing our own space story. In Maths, we have been learning

about the different 3D shapes and we have just started our unit on position and direction. The y1's have also been learning about the numbers up to 100 and counting and forward and backwards. In DT, we have been learning how to make levers and sliders as we are going to be making a moving space picture. In Science, we have been identifying objects and naming the material they are made from. In R.E, we have been learning about why Christians celebrate the Christmas story. We have been hard at work practising our own

Nativity show.

SYCAMORE

We are looking at the skeletal system and using the technical terms for our bones. We are planning an investigation to answer the question, 'Do people with longer femurs jump further?' We have spent time looking at the meaning of bullying and banter as part of Anti-bullying week and looking at how we show kindness. In Outdoor learning, we created a kindness tree. We have drafted, edited and published our versions of a chapter of The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark, which read really well. In Maths, Y2 are now learning to subtract, whilst Y3 have been mastering the 3, 4 and 8 times table.

OAK

Oak class have continued their History by looking at some Horrible jobs from the past including 'Groom of the Stool', who had the great job of wiping the King's bottom! In music we've explored royal fanfares and how these are written. We then had a go at composing our own using rhythm notation. We've come to the end of our 'Highway Man' unit in English and the children have written some incredible alternative endings; they've used all of their skills to create complex sentences, setting descriptions and punctuate speech correctly.

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OPAL



Our first wave of playtime improvements will be starting in January and we have a working party of staff and parents meeting regularly to improve our playground and play areas. The plan is to have zones with quieter play/active play/ creative play/dressing up etc. We are collecting scooters to use on the path to the field and any dressing up/dinosaurs/cars or old saucepans would be welcome donations.

One issue we have identified is that in the winter there is not enough space on the playground for everyone to play the different games they want, but mud is walked into school if children play on the grassy areas. Our plan from January onwards is for play to happen outdoors whatever the weather (serious conditions will be the exception). For this to happen everyone will need a waterproof coat to wear on wet days and to wear wellies when it is muddy.

We have built welly storage for every class so it is now ready to be filled with **NAMED WELLIES for every child.**

We will keep some spares for emergency welly wearing. THANK YOU


